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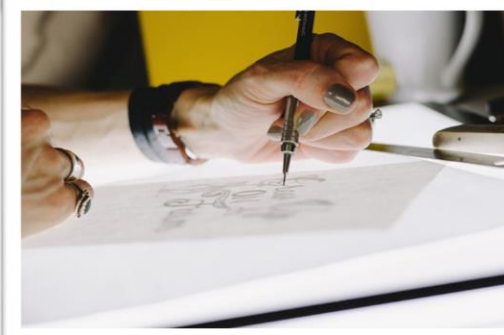

Introduction

About the Sector

About the Job Role

Storyboard Artist need to be able to draw people, objects, actions, and environments, legibly and efficiently and require strong visual storytelling skills to bring a script to life prior to production. They create a visual representation of the animation's narrative. They translate the script and the director's vision into pictures. They produce a series of panels of images to plan the shots and ensure continuity between them.

Minimum Qualifications

The candidate should have passed Grade 8, possesses the ability to read/write and communicate effectively.
