Online Meeting of Joint Working Committee Meeting held between NCERT, EDUFI, and GINTL: 18th December 2024

The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT), in collaboration with the Finnish National Agency for Education (EDUFI) and Global Innovation Network for Teaching and Learning (GINTL) India, convened the third Joint Working Committee (JWC) Meeting to mark the conclusion of the GINTL project and explore future avenues of partnership.

The virtual meeting held on 18th December 2024 brought together key stakeholders from NCERT, Finnish educational institutions, and EDUFI to reflect on the collaboration's journey, exchange insights, and discuss sustaining relationships post-GINTL. In his opening remarks, Prof. Dinesh Prasad Saklani, Director, NCERT expressed appreciation for the fruitful partnership, highlighting the shared efforts in enhancing early childhood education and vocational education. Prof. Anna-Maija Poikkeus, Dean at the University of Jyväskylä (JYU) and GINTL lead echoed the sentiment, emphasizing the value of cross-border cooperation in shaping innovative educational frameworks.



Ms. Apoorwa Hooda, GINTL's India Coordinator, provided a comprehensive overview of collaborative activities, underscoring the project's key milestones and contributions to India's evolving education landscape. Participants highlighted pilot programmes, curriculum development, and capacity-building initiatives that aimed to align educational strategies with industry needs and international best practices.

Dr Vinay Swarup Mehrotra, Professor and Head, Centre for International Relationship at PSSCIVE presented the activities organised for sharing experiences on vocational education.

The meeting concluded with a forward-looking session led by Mr. Juha Ketolainen, Senior Advisor at EDUFI, who outlined plans for extending cooperation beyond 2025 through a renewed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU).
